



# Kayak Fishing Weekend

## September 24, 25, 26, 2010

This **Beyond Becoming an Outdoors-Woman (BOW)** event is for **experienced** kayakers with some spin fishing experience. Participants must bring their own spin casting rod and reel and kayak. The goal of this course is to introduce you to what it takes to fish from a kayak. Fifteen lucky women will join **BOW** staff and Fish and Game's **Let's Go Fishing Program** instructors for this fun and educational weekend at the beautiful Purity Spring resort in Madison, NH. [www.PuritySpring.com](http://www.PuritySpring.com) Some of the topics that will be covered throughout the weekend are: rigging your kayak for fishing; fishing techniques – casting, using lures, bait and trolling; fishing equipment and tackle; what to do when you catch a fish; and safety. A fishing license is not required during scheduled class time.

**The cost for the weekend is \$275**, which includes instruction, program materials, use of demonstration equipment, Friday evening reception (does not include Friday dinner), all meals on Saturday, breakfast and lunch on Sunday and lodging.

**Registration opens June 28, 2010.** Upon being registered, you will be sent a written confirmation that you have been accepted to the program, along with an information packet. If the program is full, you will be put on a waiting list until August 27, 2010. If no space becomes available, your check will be returned or your credit card will be refunded at that time.
